
**ORDER GRANTING PLAINTIFFS' EMERGENCY MOTION FOR
TEMPORARY RESTRAINING ORDER**

Upon review of Plaintiffs' Emergency Motion for Temporary Restraining Order, and having considered counsels' briefs and arguments, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Plaintiffs' Motion is GRANTED in part.

The Court therefore ORDERS that Defendants, their agents, officers, and employees, and all others in active concert or participation with them, are temporarily restrained from:

1. Enforcing the Mandate against the current members of the CBA that fit within Groups II and III that joined the CBA after June 4, 2014 (“Post-Injunction Members”);
2. Charging or assessing taxes, penalties, or other burdens against these Post-Injunction Members for failure to pay for, provide, or directly or indirectly facilitate access to CASC services; and
3. Interfering with these Post-Injunction Members’ relationships with their insurers or third party administrators and with these members’ attempts to arrange or contract for morally compliant health or stop-loss coverage or related services for their employees and members.
4. Consistent with the Order issued on June 4, 2014 in Case No. 14-CV-240-R, the Court declines to extend this relief to the Catholic Insurance Company and the Post-Injunction Group I Members of the CBA.
